

#### WHAT WE DO

As the Culture and Way of Life (CWOL) team, we are committed to promoting and delivering Métis cultural programming. We play a key role in nurturing Métis pride, building connections, and offering culturally grounded resources. We support and guide cultural events and programming, develop new resources, support community wellness, host initiatives for youth and families, and engage with Elders and Knowledge Holders to ensure our work is respectful. In resisting colonial impacts, it is essential to promote our history, values, culture, languages, and traditions—so that Métis youth and families feel pride in their heritage and the stories of Métis are honoured and shared.

#### YOUTH CULTURE CAMPS

Our Youth Culture Camps connect Métis youth in grades 10 to 12 (ages 15–18) with Senators, Knowledge Holders, and MNO staff through seasonal, land-based gatherings that preserve and celebrate traditional and contemporary Métis culture and way of life. These immersive camps offer meaningful opportunities for participants to deepen their understanding of Métis knowledge systems, strengthen leadership and resilience, and foster a strong sense of belonging and self-determination. The program emphasizes teamwork, personal growth, and reflection through hands-on, culturally rooted activities delivered in dynamic outdoor and community settings.

#### MARCH BREAK CAMP

Our Infinite Reach March Break Camp is a 5-day, 4-night land-based experience designed to empower self-identified Métis students in grades 10 to 12 (ages 15-18) through cultural connection and post-secondary exploration. Facilitated by staff, Infinite Reach Facilitators, Knowledge Holders, and Senators, the camp weaves together hands-on activities and community-building to support youth as they prepare for life and education after high school. Program themes include Métis culture and identity, post-secondary access and planning, financial literacy, mental wellness, labour market exploration, and an introduction to the Infinite Reach Student Solidarity Network and MNO programs and services. Participants strengthen their confidence, develop a deeper sense of belonging, and gain pride in their Métis culture.

#### **CULTURE & WAY OF LIFE SUPPORT**

The Culture & Way of Life team develops and delivers culturally grounded programming and support for both internal and external partners, including community councils, citizens, staff, volunteers, governments, and educational collaborators. Within the MNO, the team provides mentorship, advisory support, and cultural expertise to guide the development of resources and activities, fostering a deeper understanding of Métis histories and values.

#### **ABOUT EDUCATION & TRAINING**

The MNO began to offer training initiatives in 1996 with funding from the Métis Human Resources Development Agreement. Since then, the Education and Training Branch has grown and developed to include a comprehensive infrastructure that delivers a full range of programs. It supports the educational success of all Métis across Ontario, beginning in early learning, continuing through kindergarten to grade twelve, into adulthood through post-secondary education, and then into employment. We also work to retain and revitalize our languages, honour our culture and way of life, and provide ongoing learning outside formal education structures.

We take pride in our culture and history, recognize and honour the Métis knowledge holders and senators who contribute to our way of life, teaching and learning opportunities, and take pride in our Métis languages. We look forward to sharing our traditions with future generations as we aspire to achieve our highest potential.

### **ET BRANCH SASH**

One of the most prominent symbols of the Métis Nation is the brightly coloured, woven sash. Originally used by voyageurs for both practical purposes and cultural expression, the sash has roots in Eastern Woodland finger-weaving and French-Canadian tradition. In 2022, the Education & Training Branch introduced its own special sash, featuring colours representing the different teams and important ideologies.

Light Green: Early Learning & Child Care
Purple: Kindergarten - Grade 12
Light Blue: Post-Secondary Education
Yellow: Métis Languages Initiatives
Red: Employment & Training
Dark Green: All E&T programs coming
together to support a Métis person's
lifelong learning journey
Dark Blue: Métis inclusion in all
learning environments
