

This book recounts the life of Louis Riel and his courageous advocacy for the rights and identity of the Métis people. Featuring a diverse collection of illustrations created using various mediums—such as felt board pieces, plasticine, real-life photographs, and drawings—it vividly brings Riel's story to life. Through its engaging visuals and narrative, this book fosters awareness and understanding of Louis Riel's pivotal role in Métis heritage and history.

Scaffolding Activities

November 16th: Remembering Louis Riel Planning meaningful activities to incorporate Métis heritage into your learning environment can help children connect with this important part of history. After reading a book about Louis Riel, consider engaging children in activities that celebrate Métis culture and heritage

- Sashes in Dramatic Play: Provide
 Métis sashes in the dramatic play area
 for children to use creatively—as belts,
 baby carriers, or tools—encouraging
 exploration and role-play.
- Music and Movement: Play traditional Métis fiddle music and provide spoons for children to experiment with creating rhythms and beats, promoting musical exploration and movement.
